## LEARNING UPDATE

Year R	<p>This week we have been on an ocean adventure in Pufferfish whilst looking at the book Commotion in the Ocean. We have been exploring what you might find lurking at the bottom of ocean and made our very own Pufferfish pirate ship!</p> <p>We have created some beautiful pictures during our art lesson this week inspired by Vincent Van Gogh's Sunflower painting, we really enjoyed exploring the use of oil pastels to mix and blend colours.</p> <p>We enjoyed spending some of our lunchtime play this week in the main playground, Mrs Newton and Mrs Fuller were so proud of their fantastic behaviour. Well done Pufferfish!</p>
Year 1	<p>Within English we have been creating and innovating our very own story based on the Three Little Pigs. They have come up with some fantastic ideas and we cannot wait to write them next week. In maths, we have been exploring money comparing and identifying a range of amounts. In PSHE, we have been learning about the difference between teasing, being unkind and bullying, and who we can go to if we need help. In RE, we have been continuing our discussion about special books. In Computing, Dolphins can now all change sprites (characters) in Scratch Jr and use algorithms to programme them. Parents - Scratch Jr app is free to download on a tablet; you just need an email address to set up a free account. In Science, we started to identify common and wild garden plants. Perhaps you could ask your children when you are in the park next, or on a walk. In History, we have been continuing our investigations into Victorian holidays and we have been fascinated by their inventions! Even though it may be cooling down next week, please continue to send in hats and sun cream!</p>
Year 2	<p>Penguins have been absolutely amazing this week. Even though they've taken their test papers they've made it seem like a breeze. Whilst some were doing the test papers the rest of us had computing and art for our morning lessons. In computing this week, we have looked at Scratch Junior and creating algorithms, the children really enjoyed this and were able to explain what they had done. In Art we looked at some pictures of the animals we spotted at Marwell zoo, we then thought about how we can draw those thinking about shape, size, tone and shading. They even took on feedback from their peers on what they could do now and applied that to drawing the picture again. These were beautifully drawn and the children were very impressed with their end product. We also have had science this week and planted our own sunflowers, the children have been keeping a</p>

	<p>close eye on them to see who's is starting to grow first. You have been fantastic this week Penguins, keep it up!</p>
Year 3	<p>This week, Year 3 have worked incredibly hard to complete our end of year assessments in SPaG, Reading and Maths. Your children have worked so so hard and have, as a result, made excellent progress. I am so proud of them and I know will continue to make progress into Year 4 and beyond. In English we have edited and published our narrative writing. In Maths, we have learnt about acute, right and obtuse angles as well as vertical and horizontal lines. Our Music lessons have been really fun as we are lucky enough to have some tabla drums from Portsmouth Music Service to learn how to play Indian music.</p>
Year 4	<p>What a successful week for Year 4! We started the week receiving the results of our multiplication times tables check. The results below speak for themselves!</p> <p>19 or below = 4 children 15%  20 or above = 23 children 85%  of which 11 children achieved full marks of 25/25 = 40%</p> <p>Staff across the school have expressed how amazing these results are and how proud they are of this cohort of Year 4 pupils! Sea Otters should be immensely proud of what they have achieved. The children have continued to nurture their resilient mindsets during their assessments this week where progress has been across all core areas. To celebrate the children and their achievements, we ended the week with ice poles in the playground. Well done Year 4, we are super proud of you!</p>
Year 5	<p>This week we have been learning about how to convert between different units of measure. We have been impressed with the in-depth mathematical discussions heard around the classroom about how to tackle some of the more challenging problem solving tasks! In Science we have been exploring the work of Jane Goodall and how she became an expert in the behaviour of chimpanzees. The class have enjoyed designing their own appeals for the Jane Goodall Foundation. We have completed a few assessments this week and have been incredibly proud of the resilience and maturity of the class. Well done Year 5!</p>
Year 6	<p>Now that Year 6 are all back together after a brilliant week away or off timetable, we have enjoyed lots more rehearsals and the show is now coming together with props and backdrops - if you have any costume bits for your child, please start to bring these in from next week. Ask the children what they need as they already have a good idea of costumes for their characters.</p> <p>We have begun to look at reproduction in science, starting with plants; however, this will lead into PSHE for our relationships and sex education. The children have so far, had a really mature approach to this. In this</p>

	<p>week's PSHE, we looked into changes in preparation for secondary school, including the emotions surrounding this and ways to deal with them. In PE we began sports day practise, working in teams to score points on a range of activities!</p> <p>Just a reminder that next week is transition for most secondary schools - this will involve your child walking to/getting dropped off and picked up from their new school.</p>

The aim is to cook something different each week, giving the young people opportunities to learn different cooking skills. So far they have made a tuna pasta bake, a sausage casserole and an apple pudding. Everybody gets a portion to take home with them that evening.

### Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Fun Pompey

What is HAF?

In November 2020 the government announced the significant expansion of it's Holiday Activities and Food Programme. Portsmouth City Council registered to participate and were delighted to be allocated funding by the Department of Education (DfE). The programme is designed to provide healthy food and enriching activities during the Easter, Summer and Christmas holidays to children who receive benefits-related free school meals.

It offers valuable support to families on lower incomes, giving them the opportunity to access rewarding and active activities alongside healthy meals over the school holidays.

Families who are eligible for FSM will be able to book via the booking system ([via Eequ](#)) when the summer programme launches on **Monday 10 June 2024**. The slots fill up very quickly and are based on a first come first served system. Westover Primary School is one of the locations available to parents.
